

ArtsNow Learning has been selected to receive funding through the US Department of Education's (USDOE) Assistance for Arts Education Development and Dissemination Grants Competition (AAEDD). We have been awarded more than **\$2.27 million over four years to fund our SmART Literacy project in four elementary schools in both Georgia and South Carolina.** ArtsNow's SmART Literacy initiative will deliver professional development and job-embedded training in literacy-based arts integration to Angel Oak Elementary School in Charleston County School District, as well as Savannah-Chatham County Public Schools' Garrison School for the Arts, Heard Elementary School, and Marshpoint Elementary School. ArtsNow's curriculum consultants will work with 124 educators to improve their ability to effectively integrate various art forms with their literacy-focused content. The project will benefit more than 2,300 students in kindergarten through 5th grades, improving students' reading level and writing skills, while also increasing engagement and enjoyment of learning. We are incredibly honored to have received this grant!

Newest ArtsNow Learning Team Member

We are excited to announce that Whitney Snuggs will be joining the ArtsNow team December 1, 2018 as the project coordinator for the new AAEDD grant, SmART Literacy. Whitney has been a dance consultant with ArtsNow this past year and has been an incredible contractual team member. She was an elementary teacher and served as an arts integration team lead in her school. In addition, she worked at the Gwinnett Ballet as a dancer and teacher. Whitney Snuggs and Dee Morris worked with the students of West Clayton Elementary and Tara Elementary to integrate choreography and math for 4th and 5th grade students. As part of the lesson, students created a ten step choreography piece and had to identify the fractions, decimals, equivalencies, and expressions to accompany their specific dance. It was such an engaging lesson and the students' depth of knowledge was incredible. One teacher was so excited, she created her own choreography as well!




North Metro Academy of Performing Arts

One of our newest partners in Gwinnett County (Georgia) had the opportunity to work with Darlene Guida as she integrated music and

literacy for the students of North Metro Academy of Performing Arts. The students used rhythm and beat to increase fluency and rhythmic speech.

These lessons were presented as demonstration lessons, in which the teachers process observe in order to take the strategies back to their own classrooms. LaBelle Elementary School

Debi West led the students of LaBelle Elementary School, located in Cobb County (Georgia), through a visual arts and math lesson based on the works of Wassily Kandinsky. Students in kindergarten through fifth grade learned visual arts and math vocabulary while creating their own masterpieces of art using a rubric based on geometric shapes, line segments, angles, and proportions/scale.
