<b>Writing Process</b>	Student devotes a great deal of time and effort to the writing process (prewriting, drafting, reviewing, and editing). Works hard to make the monologue the best it can be.	Student devotes sufficient time and effort to the writing process (prewriting, drafting, reviewing, and editing). <b>Point of View of the Organelle</b>	The point of view of the character portrayed in the monologue is clearly developed through the monologue. There is evidence that the point of view has been analyzed and the relationship it has to the other organelles is clearly defined.	Most of the monologue is written in the point of view of the organelle being portrayed. The monologue wanders off at one point, but the reader can still learn something about the topic.	Some of the monologue is in the point of view of the organelle, but a reader does not learn much about the topic.	No attempt has been made to relate the writing to any particular point of view.
<b>Accuracy of Facts</b>	All facts presented about the organelle in the monologue are accurate. The facts presented allow the reader to understand much more about the topic.	Almost all facts presented in the monologue are accurate.	Most facts presented in the monologue are accurate (at least 70%).	There are several factual errors in the monologue.
<b>Preparedness</b>	Student is completely prepared and the monologue is performed using a loud, clear voice.	Student seems mostly prepared but could have benefitted from more rehearsals. Voice is mostly loud and clear.	The student is somewhat prepared, but it is clear that rehearsal was lacking. Voice is somewhat loud and clear.	Student is not prepared to present. Student often mumbles or can not be understood.
