Exciting Partnership in the Savannah-Chatham Region

Clayton County PDAE Grant Update

ArtsNow Learning continues as the lead partner with Clayton County Public Schools and their Professional Development for Arts Educators (PDAE) federal grant. This month, STEAM consultant Jeff Mather, offered professional development to the arts and math teachers, as well as student demonstration lessons at local schools. Dr. Tamara Pearson, from CEISMC, Dee Morris, ArtsNow Learning Curriculum Consultant, and Kathy Baker, PDAE Grant Coordinator from Clayton County, support the professional learning and offer strategies to increase math achievement through arts-integration. We are very excited to see the growth in academic achievement for the grant schools in Clayton County!





Henry County Schools

ArtsNow Learning remains very excited about our partnership with Henry County Schools. We are currently supporting four schools: Fairview Elementary School, Hampton Elementary School, New Hope Elementary School, and McDonough Middle School. The delivery model for Henry includes teacher professional learning in a particular art form, followed up with student demonstration lessons at each individual school in that same art form. During the month of October theater consultant, Susie Spear Purcell, provided theater strategies to be integrated into the content areas of math, language arts, science, and social studies. 


Richmond County, Georgia


October was a very busy month for teachers and students in Hephzibah,

supporting this initiative. We remain thankful for the Chestnut Family


Foundation and the support they are providing the children of Hephzibah, Georgia!













Cobb County School District

ArtsNow Learning is honored to continue expanding and deepening our partnership with Cobb County School District and we had a busy month of professional learning with schools across the district.

We kicked off the first of four days of training for the Cobb County STEAM Innovation Series with Melissa Ditmar Joy providing three different professional learning sessions addressing the integration of dance and movement with math and science. Throughout the day, over 100 educators from 30 different schools were in attendance.

ArtsNow Learning also facilitated the first of four days of training for the Cobb County Arts Integration Series with Shannon Green providing two half-day professional learning sessions focused on visual arts integration. We worked with 63 teachers, who teach kindergarten through 12th grade.

Powder Springs Elementary, an ArtsNow Learning Leadership School, had a Demonstration of Learning Day where educators and leaders from across the state were invited to tour the school and observe arts integration in action. With overwhelming interest, 82 guests participated in this learning opportunity. In addition, ArtsNow Learning hosted a Principals' Network Luncheon to continue supporting leaders who are embracing arts integration efforts in their local

schools.

As part of the two days she spent with teachers and students, she was able to provide demonstration lessons in K-5 classrooms and was able to plan with all K-5 teachers. The grant provides the opportunity for teachers to learn arts integration strategies to support student success in literacy.





Arts in Education Conference

Ireland International Conference on Education

Pamela's presentation was about using authentic arts integration to support student engagement and 21st century skills. ArtsNow Learning is so proud of Pam's ongoing ambassadorship for using the arts in education. Using her national and international platforms have allowed her to share about all of our school and district projects, grants, and key partnerships with worldwide

constituencies. Representatives at IICE were from South Africa, England, Canada, Portugal, Spain, Malaysia, United States of America, Saudi Arabia, Korea, Ireland, and France just to name a few. The international interest of arts in education is at an all-time high, and Pam was able to present ideas and strategies that participants would be able to take back to their respective institutions.
