

What is arts-integrated learning?

Arts integration is designed to be a joyful, active, and memorable learning experience. Incorporating the five recognized arts disciplines — visual arts, dance, theatre, music, and digital media — along with common core standards and fine arts standards, the arts become an approach to teaching, as well as a vehicle for learning.

This year, ArtsNOW hosted six **Demonstration of Learning Days** at Leadership Schools across the region. These half-day events welcomed educators, district leaders, and community members to see arts integration in action.

Visitors observed students deeply engaged in creative, standards-based learning, both in classrooms and through process boards lining the hallways. Each event spotlighted a different model, from STEAM-certified schools to magnet programs and district-wide residencies.

Expanding Access Through Arts Grow SC

Since 2022, ArtsNOW has partnered with Arts Grow SC and the South Carolina Arts Commission to bring arts-integrated learning to 22 schools across 12 districts. In total, 11,014 students and 784 educators have been engaged in creative, meaningful learning experiences that support both academic and personal growth.



Recognized for What Works in Education

ArtsNOW was named a finalist for the 2025 Dick and Tunky Riley WhatWorksSC Award, presented by The Riley Institute at Furman University. This prestigious honor highlights programs making a lasting impact on public education in South Carolina.

Celebrating ArtsNOW Partner School Angel Oak Elementary

Angel Oak Elementary received the 2024 South Carolina School of Excellence in Arts Education Award. The school has created a dynamic, arts-integrated learning environment that makes the arts essential to every student's education.

Growth in Georgia

Our work across Georgia continues to grow through strong partnerships and targeted support for schools. These recent developments have expanded our reach and deepened our impact.

The Zeist Foundation Supports Metro Atlanta Schools

A generous grant from the Zeist Foundation enabled us to partner with four schools in Atlanta Public Schools and DeKalb County, bringing arts-integrated learning to more students and educators across the region.

SmART Literacy Expansion in Fulton County

Support from the Joseph B. Whitehead Foundation allowed us to expand our SmART Literacy initiative into four additional Fulton County schools, strengthening early literacy through the arts.



Literacy Leadership with Learn4Life

As an Early Literacy Bright Spot, we continue our strong partnership with Learn4Life. This year, our team completed training in the Science of Reading to better support district literacy goals through arts integration.

















Making Partnership Visible

This year, ArtsNOW introduced **Partner School Kits** to help schools proudly share their commitment to arts integration. The kits were designed to increase awareness across each school community and share that their school is partnering with ArtsNOW to bring creative, engaging learning to students.

Each kit included yard signs, window clings, staff stickers, a social media guide, promotional tools, and more. These kits marked the start of a momentum-building journey, helping schools amplify their role as centers of arts-integrated learning.

From Routine to Resonance

Before ArtsNOW, reading time often followed a familiar pattern: students listened, answered questions, and moved on. But when ArtsNOW Music Consultant Dr. Rue Lee-Holmes stepped into a third-grade classroom, everything changed.

Through a powerful lesson blending English Language Arts and music, students discovered how rhythm, melody, and lyrics could bring a story to life. Literature wasn't just read—it was felt.

"Students were engaged from the get-go!" a teacher observed.

"This was so cool—we didn't know music could tell a story like that!" one student shared.

Our national and international reach continued to grow this year, reflecting ArtsNOW's leadership in arts-integrated education and the momentum behind our work:

- ArtsNOW partnered in the global Crayola Creativity Week, sharing arts integration in classrooms around the world.
- Executives Pamela Walker and Crystal Collins gave keynote presentations at international education conferences in London, Hawaii, and Ireland, sharing ArtsNOW's approach with global education leaders.
- ArtsNOW was published in the Literacy Information and Computer Education Journal with an article titled "Using Arts Integration to Improve Student Literacy."
- ArtsNOW team members shared our work at state and national conferences across the country, including the National Young Audiences Arts for Learning RAISE Conference, Arts Education Partnership Convening, Assistance for Arts in Education Conference, and others, highlighting the impact of arts integration in schools.



Confidence in Motion

On the first day, she was quiet, watchful, unsure, and staying near the edges of the room. But everything shifted during a dance-integrated lesson.

That same student stepped boldly into the center of the circle when ArtsNOW Dance Consultant Tamara Irving asked for a volunteer to help lead the Brain Dance Warmup. She guided the class with confidence and joy, transforming hesitation into leadership.

"I lit up, too!" Tamara shared. "The day before, she was shy. But the arts gave her a way in."

Vibrant Communities

ArtsNOW received three Vibrant Communities Grants from the Georgia Council for the Arts to support creative learning experiences in Barrow County, Georgia.



At the Arts & Innovation Magnet, Artful Afternoons provided free after-school arts sessions for students in grades K-5.



At Yargo Elementary, students integrated visual arts with science and created original artworks to explore key concepts.



Students created a collaborative, sensory-rich art installation now on display at Holsenbeck Elementary.

Thriving Support from Donors

Last year, ArtsNOW piloted two giving campaigns to raise awareness and grow donor support. During National Arts in Education Week, we raised nearly \$10,000 while spotlighting the powerful role of the arts in student learning. Our Sustain Joyful Learning campaign encouraged ongoing support through recurring gifts, resulting in over 60 committed donors in the spring.

We are deeply grateful for every contribution. These campaigns reflect our continued focus on expanding our donor base and diversifying revenue to sustain and grow our impact.

Finding Joy in Fractions

"I never knew fractions could be fun. I actually understand them now." That was the moment a fifthgrade student lit up during a visual arts lesson.

Led by ArtsNOW Visual Arts Consultant Stephanie Lancaster, the class used Piet Mondrian-inspired artwork to explore math in a way that felt creative, hands-on, and meaningful.

"I have seven students with IEPs, and you'd never know who," the teacher shared. "Every student was finding success!"

Laying the Groundwork

Each year, the ArtsNOW **Foundational Seminar** brings together K-12 educators to build a strong foundation in arts-integrated instructional strategies. Through hands-on learning and collaboration, participants gain practical tools to engage students and carry momentum back to their classrooms.

Federal Grants Fueling Innovation and Impact

ArtsNOW is proud to lead and support several federally funded initiatives that expand access to arts-integrated learning. We are especially grateful that each of these grants has received continuation funding, allowing us to build on early success and carry this momentum forward.

Educational Advancement for STEM Engagement (EASE)

In January 2025, ArtsNOW was named a lead partner with National Young Audiences Arts for Learning in a federal grant awarded through the U.S. Department of Education's Education Innovation and Research Program.

In this five-year initiative, ArtsNOW and Young Audiences Louisiana will bring arts-integrated STEM learning to schools in Georgia, South Carolina, and Louisiana. ArtsNOW is leading professional learning and curriculum development for this multi-state effort, beginning with two of our own leadership schools.



REimagining and Accelerating Literacy through Arts Integration (REALAI)

Through the REALAI grant, ArtsNOW supports over 2,700 students and 170 educators across six schools in Georgia and South Carolina with professional learning, book giveaways, and arts-integrated resources to boost literacy.

At J.C. Lynch Elementary, a REALAI partner school, third-grade ELA scores rose by 36% in one year—outperforming the state average and showing the power of literacy through the arts.



STEM + the Art of Integrated Learning (SAIL)

Through its SAIL grant, ArtsNOW is developing inquiry-based, arts-integrated math and science lessons for grades 3–5. The project serves over 2,200 students and 114 teachers across six elementary schools, combining high-quality instructional units with ongoing professional learning.

To show one example of the grant's impact, 33.6% of students in SAIL schools demonstrated high growth in math, compared to 29% of the comparison students.



In Their Own Words

At ArtsNOW, we know the work we're doing matters when we hear it directly from the students we support.

In this video, three students reflect about how arts-integrated learning shaped their educational journey. Now in middle and high school, they credit their early experiences with helping them grow in confidence, creativity, and communication.

Leading the Way Forward


